YBC MISSION STATEMENT

REQUIREMENTS

- Under 40 years old or in the industry for less than 5 years
- RIBO Licence in good standing
- Employed by an IBAO member brokerage

TIME COMMITMENT

- 2 full-day meetings held in Toronto at the IBAO office: February and May
- Host at least one YBC Event annually in your territory (additional community involvement encouraged)
- Involvement with local career fairs and other industry recruitment initiatives
- Attend IBAO’s annual Convention, and YBC’s annual Conference

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

IBAO covers costs for:

- Travel expenses and accommodations for scheduled meetings (for those travelling far distances - *at the discretion of IBAO*)
- Travel expenses and accommodations for annual IBAO Convention
- Travel expenses **only** for YBC Conference (Team Leaders responsible for registration and hotel costs)

TEAM LEADER DUTIES

- Connect and communicate with Young Brokers within your territory frequently, and bring feedback to meetings based on an adequate sample size
- Prepare reports on networking events and send to Team Leaders, IBAO and Territory Director
- Expected preparedness for meetings - *read all materials and communications prior to meeting*
- Participate in Property Committee duties at Annual Convention (helping set up signage, or other duties as assigned)
- Build a relationship with OSAID (Ontario Students Against Impaired Driving) student representative
- Contribute to the execution of YBC goals and objectives as it relates to IBAO’s Long Range Plan
